The de Havilland Aeronautical Technical School Association PYLON on CD

THE SIX editions of PYLON collected on this CDy span fifteen years of commemoration of the founding of the **de Havilland Aeronautical Technical School.** PYLON was published through the 1930s, but was suspended on the outbreak of WW2. After the war it was published at intervals until 1954. A revival in the winter of 1963 continued until 1970. After the school combined with the Hawker Siddeley Aviation training schemes in 1965, at least half-a-dozen editions of PYLON were issued, jointly as the journal of the then DHAeTS Old Boys Association and of the HSA schools.

The current revival was in August 1998, arranged to coincide with the reunion to celebrate the 70th anniversary of the school's founding. It was an inspired and painstaking assembly of choice extracts from many previous issues, the earliest being from the very first printed PYLON of July 1933. This resurrection had no special title, but has become known as "PYLON 70".

As the next five years passed, another reunion was planned in August 2003 for the school's 75th birthday. For this, the DHAeTS Association Committee decided that a completely new edition was appropriate: PYLON 75. A willing volunteer was persuaded to take on the task of compiling it.

For a while, it was felt that the next issue would mark the school's 80th birthday. Then an awareness arose that some of the more mature members might not be completely happy to wait that long, so an interim edition was approved, issued for Christmas 2005. This has the nickname "Pylon $77^{1}/2$ ".

Finally, the 80th anniversary approached, and PYLON 80 was completed in time for the celebratory reunion in June 2008. This turned out to be one of the fattest-ever editions, after which its compiler decided to call it a day.

PYLON 2011 and PYLON 85, the latter marking the School's 85th birthday, are the work of a new volunteer team.
